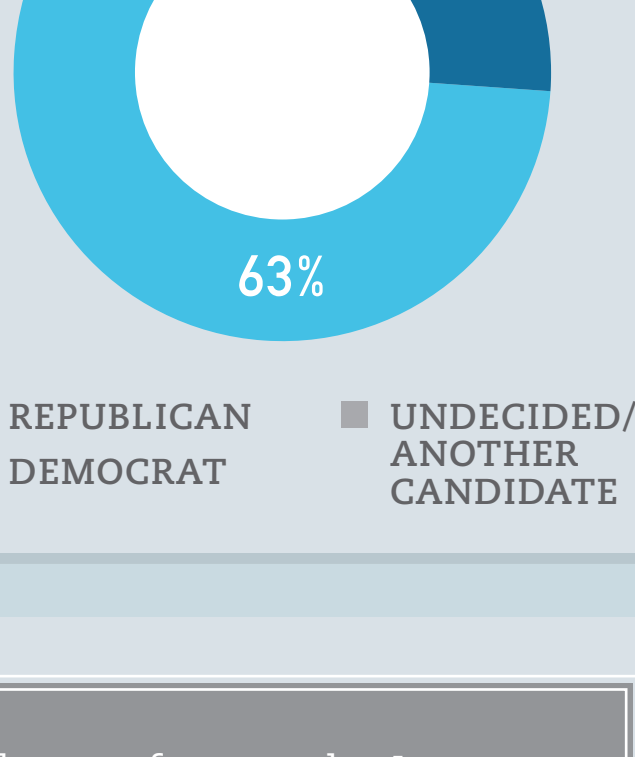




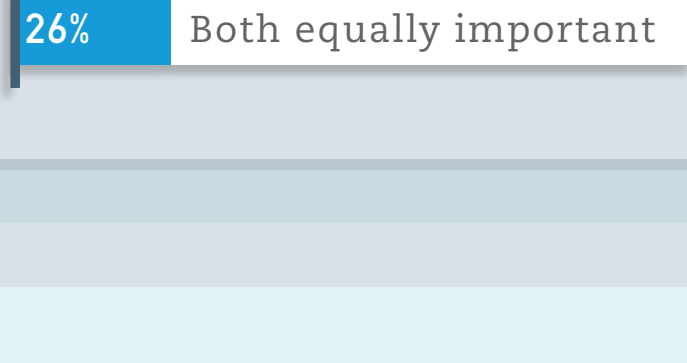
2018 SUMMER BATTLEGROUND POLL ASIAN AMERICAN AND PACIFIC ISLANDER RESULTS

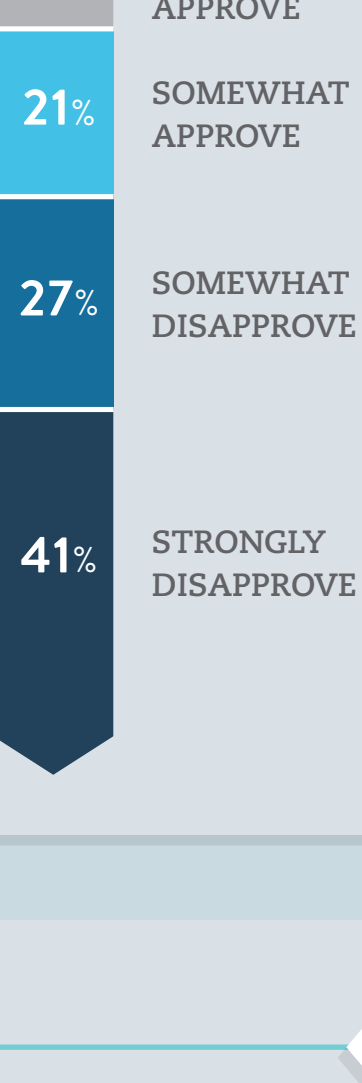

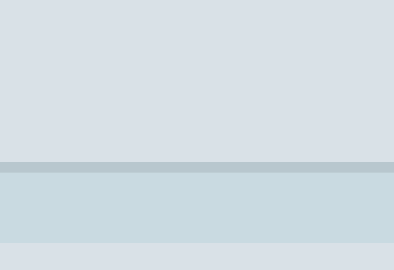

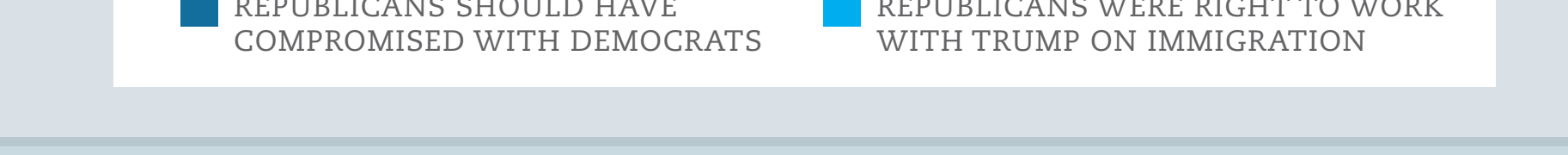

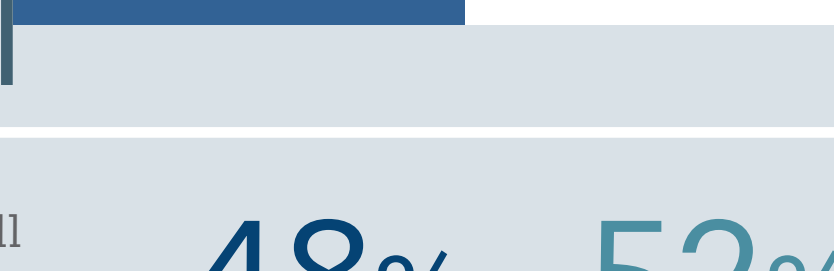

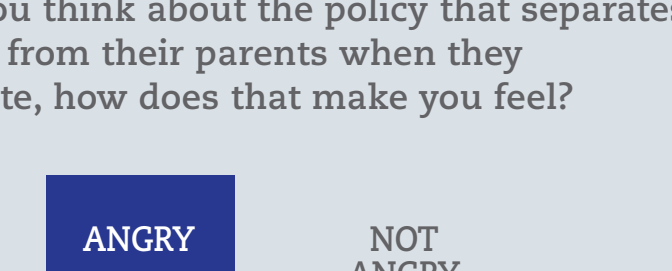


FAMILY SEPARATION

What do you think about the Trump Administration's policy of separating children from parents detained at the border?

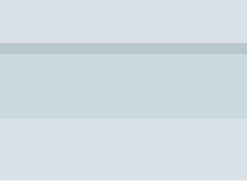


Do you believe the Trump administration will follow its June 2018 Executive Order stating that children should no longer be separated from their parents?



Which of the following is closest to your opinion?

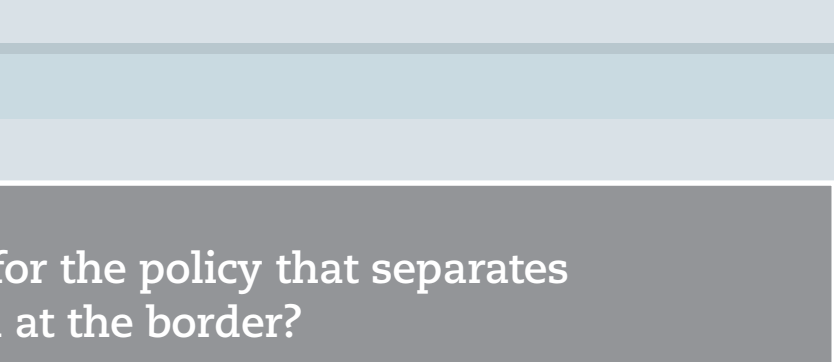
The United States government should lock up and detain undocumented immigrant children who are fleeing violence and seeking asylum, even if they are kept with their parents in holding cells or detention centers.



The United States government should have a policy that does not lock-up immigrant children at all.



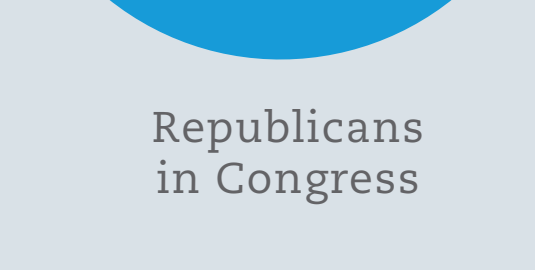
When you think about the policy that separates children from their parents when they immigrate, how does that make you feel?

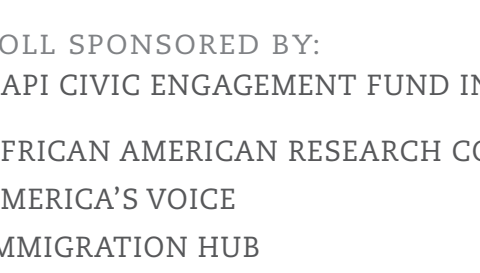

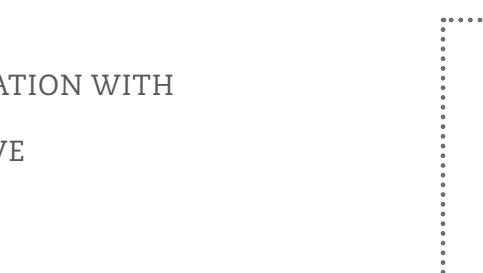

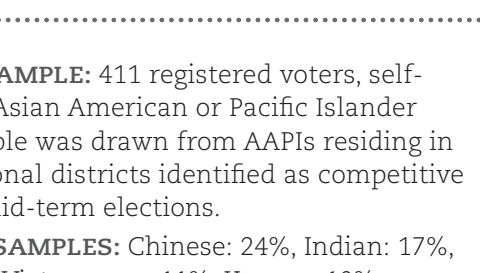

NATIONAL SAMPLE: 411 registered voters, self-identified as Asian American or Pacific Islander (AAPIs). Sample was drawn from AAPIs residing in 61 Congressional districts identified as competitive in the 2018 mid-term elections.
SUB-GROUP SAMPLES: Chinese: 24%, Indian: 17%, Filipino: 13%, Taiwanese: 11%, Korean: 10%, Japanese: 6%, Vietnamese: 6%, Pakistani: 3%, Other Southeast Asian: 5%, Native Hawaiian and Pacific Islander: 2%, Other Asian: 5%.
