

Election Eve Methodology

Language of choice at point of contact;

All live callers;

Landline, cellphones, and online

- Sample on extreme high-propensity
 vote history plus new registrants;
- Screen on completed vote or certainty to vote;
- Past samples validated at 88% positive for cast ballot.


National Summary

- Exit polls continue to get the Asian American vote wrong.
- Asian Americans favored Clinton over Trump by a 75 to 19 margin.
- Asian Americans also heavily favored Democrats in Senate and Congressional races.
- This vote is shaped by the issues and by high negatives for Trump,
 high positive for Clinton.
- Overall mobilization remains low, but higher in battlegrounds.






Senate Races

All Other Senate races





Target State Senate Races




Congressional Races



The 76% vote in 2016 is a new high water mark of Democratic voting for Asian Americans



From Voters to Partisans


Non partisanship declined 15% between 2012 and 2016. Democratic identification increases the same 15% over this period

sides in 2016







How important is [ISSUE] in your decision to vote, and who to vote for in this election?






Has Clinton – because of the kind of person she is or because of something she has done or said, ever made you feel ...?








KEY POLICY VIEWS

The federal minimum wage should be raised to \$12 an hour.








Health Care

... has benefitted millions of Americans and should be strengthened.








Education

... increase its support of public schools, especially in the areas of teacher training, support, and compensation; reducing class size; and rebuilding decaying schools.








... to stop the deportation of immigrant parents of children born in the United States. provide undocumented immigrant youth with legal work permits and temporary relief from deportation



Lesbians, gays, bisexuals, and transgender people should not be discriminated against on the basis of their sexual orientation.



Internet and TV News Dominate


What are your main sources of news and information about politics and elections? Is it Television; Radio; a paper copy of a newspaper, or the Internet, something else?


1 in 4 Rely on Ethnic Media

For your [main sources of] news and information about politics ... do you primarily rely on English language sources, Asian language sources, or both English and Asian language sources?






